📍 Nachalat Binyamin, Tel Aviv, Israel



Join the **Tel Aviv Graffiti Tour** for a two-hour walking exploration of Nachalat Binyamin, the second-oldest neighborhood in Tel Aviv and the beating heart of the city's vibrant street art scene. This Tel Aviv Graffiti Tour takes you off the beaten path through pedestrian lanes lined with Bauhaus and Art Deco architecture, painted walls, and the satirical murals that have made the area famous. Your professional local guide reveals the stories behind featured artists including Dede, [Nitzan Mintz](#), and Rami Meiri, whose work covers entire building facades.

The Tel Aviv Graffiti Tour begins at Magen David Square and weaves through the leafy lanes of Nachalat Binyamin, which sits inside Tel Aviv's [UNESCO-listed White City](#). You will see how 1920s and 1930s architectural elements like wrought-iron balconies and pastel facades coexist with bold contemporary murals. Many of the most famous Tel Aviv graffiti artists are women and creative couples with deeply personal stories, ranging from public commemorations of an artist's cancer journey to massive walls covering political and social critique.

This Tel Aviv Graffiti Tour is the most camera-friendly experience in the city, perfect for photographers, art lovers, and travelers who want to see beyond the tourist trail. Pair the Tel Aviv Graffiti Tour with our [Tel Aviv Walking Tour](#) for full-city context, our [Jaffa Walking Tour](#) for ancient port history, or our [Jerusalem Half Day Tour](#) for a contrasting cultural experience. Tours operate Sundays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays at 15:00 in English. The tour ends at 24 Gruzenberg Street around 17:00.

Tour Itinerary

03:00 PM : Meeting Point at Magen David Square

Your Tel Aviv Graffiti Tour begins at 15:00 sharp in front of the Seven-Eleven at 1 Nachalat Binyamin Street, located on the corner of [Magen David Square](#). This central Tel Aviv square is named after the six-pointed star formed by its six converging streets.

Please arrive 5 to 10 minutes early. Your guide will be holding a Booking Tours sign. Note that this is a meeting-point tour with no hotel pickup. The nearest public transport stops include Allenby Street bus lines and the Carmel Market light rail station.

03:15 PM : Nachalat Binyamin Pedestrian Street

Step onto [Nachalat Binyamin](#), the car-free pedestrian street that gives the neighborhood its name. Established in 1909 as the second neighborhood of Tel Aviv after Neve Tzedek, it was built by and for artists, musicians, and free thinkers.

Your guide will introduce you to the area's history and walk you past wrought-iron balustrades, elegant balconies in pastel tones, and the Bauhaus and Art Deco elements that define this corner of the [UNESCO-listed White City](#). Notice the fabric shops, sidewalk cafes, and creative storefronts that still reflect the neighborhood's artisan heritage.

03:45 PM : Featured Artist Murals

Discover the work of Israel's top street artists plastered across walls that would otherwise be blank. Dede Banaid's signature bandage motif speaks of urban wounds and healing, while [Nitzan Mintz](#) is known for typographic poetry sprayed directly onto building facades.

Your guide will share the stories behind each piece, including the personal struggles, political messages, and creative collaborations that fuel the scene. Many featured artists are women and couples whose work commemorates social causes, including one wall-sized tribute to an artist's battle with cancer.

04:15 PM : Hidden Alleys and Satirical Street Art

The Tel Aviv Graffiti Tour continues into the network of lanes and alleyways that branch off from the main pedestrian street. These secret pockets contain some of the most thought-provoking pieces in the neighborhood, including satirical murals that critique Israeli politics, consumer culture, and social inequality.

Some pieces will make you laugh; others will stop you in your tracks. Your guide will explain how Nachalat Binyamin actively encourages artists to use its walls as canvases, a stark contrast to most cities where graffiti is illegal. 04:45 PM : Tour End at 24 Gruzenberg Street

The Tel Aviv Graffiti Tour concludes at approximately 17:00 at 24 Gruzenberg Street, just south of Nachalat Binyamin. From here you are within walking distance of Carmel Market, Rothschild Boulevard, and the Bauhaus heart of the White City.

Your guide can recommend nearby cafes, restaurants, and additional street art spots to explore independently. Note that there is no return transfer to your hotel. If you want to extend your Tel Aviv exploration, consider booking our [Tel Aviv Food Tour](#) at Carmel Market afterwards.
